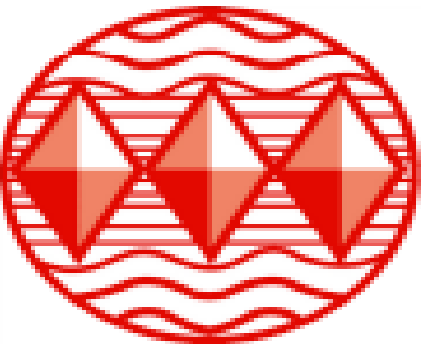


# Attendance- Parent/Carer expectations:

- Make sure their child attends everyday on time
- Contact the school to report their child's absence before 8:30am on the day of the absence **via telephone messages, Class Charts or email [attendance@highamlaneschool.co.uk](mailto:attendance@highamlaneschool.co.uk) informing school of the reason for absence** when they are expected to return. This must also be done on each subsequent day of absence.
- Ensure that, where possible, appointments for their child are made outside of the school day and after 4:00pm to account for if your child has an after school detention.

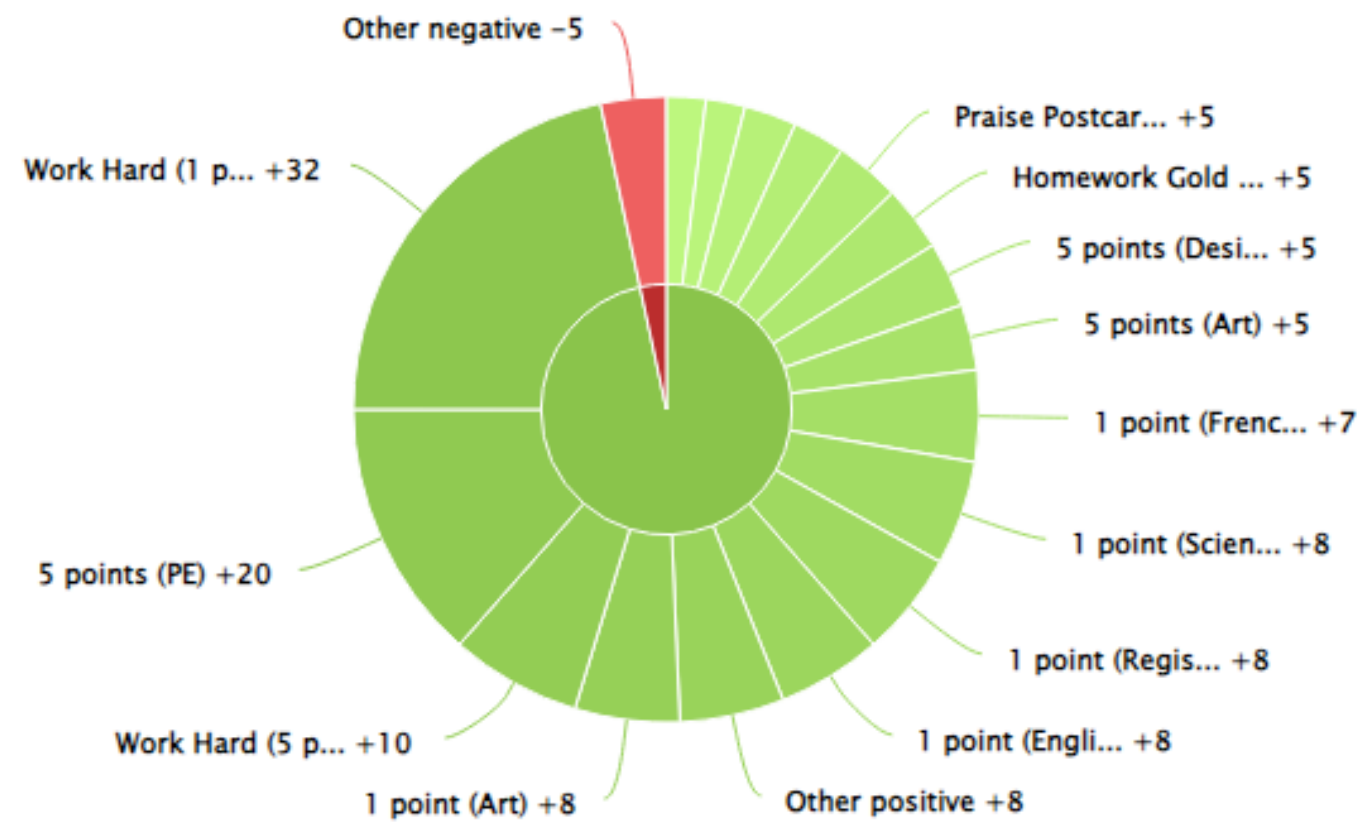
Students and parents must all have the following apps so that they can keep track of their attendance and behaviour/house points so they can be logged into the students organiser weekly.
