

#### Dear Parents and Carers

We hope you are well. It has been a fantastic week here at Higham Lane school. There have been many highlights but I would like to start by saying thank you to the staff who organised the wonderful Year 7 trip to the Royal Shakespeare company (RSC) in Stratford; the students really enjoyed the day at the RSC and we are sure that this will help with their studies as they have now seen the play brought to life.

#### Ofsted

We are due to receive an inspection from Ofsted before the end of the current academic year (due by July 2025). I wanted to give you an update on Ofsted inspections as a lot has changed since the current government came into power.

Our current Ofsted grading is Outstanding. However, please note that the one word judgement for schools has now been removed by the current government; schools that are inspected now receive a separate grading of Outstanding, Good, Requires Improvement or Inadequate in the five key areas of Quality of Education, Behaviour and Attitudes, Personal Development, Leadership and Management, and Sixth Form but there is no overall single word grade anymore.

At Higham Lane School we know that our students get a good deal, day in day out. We are ambitious with our curriculum and caring and compassionate in the pastoral support we provide. We have high expectations for all and help all students meet them. Being inspected will be an opportunity for us to showcase the outstanding things we do day in day out. The inspection framework is a lot tougher than the framework that was used when HLS was last inspected in 2019. For example, in 2023/24, only 36% of Outstanding schools retained their Outstanding grade at inspection and 64% were downgraded to Good or even lower. However, we will be aiming for Outstanding or at the least Good in all areas.

In terms of GCSE, our GCSE results last year were phenomenal and our amazing Year 11 students gave the school a Progress 8 score of +0.6, meaning that the average student achieved 0.6 of a grade higher than expected in every subject in comparison to students of a similar starting point from Key Stage 2 in primary school. This score puts HLS "well-above" national average with the highest Progress 8 score the school has ever achieved and represents the best GCSE results the school has ever achieved. In the previous school year in 2023/24, our Progress 8 school was +0.56 which was also "well-above" national average so these exceptional results last year were not a one off and these results put the school is in a very strong position for a forthcoming inspection.

Our sixth form results are equally impressive and last year 28.3% of all grades were A\* or A and 58.5% of all grades were A\*, A or B. Both of these figures are the best A Level results that the school has ever achieved. The average grade is a B and we have students going to some of the top universities in the country as a result.



In terms of behaviour, we have a strong praise and behaviour policy that rewards our amazing students by allowing them to exchange their hard-earned house points for real rewards in our Praise and Rewards shop. At present, just under 1000 students have zero negative behaviour points, meaning that they have never even forgotten a book or a piece of homework and over half of the school population have more than 100 house points which is incredible! Furthermore, our permanent exclusion and our suspension data is significantly below national average again indicating how good behaviour is here at HLS.

In terms of personal development, we deliver fantastic PSHCE lessons every week and discuss hard hitting topics such as drugs, online safety, grooming et cetera so we can do all we can to keep our students safe. We also have an extensive range of extra-curricular activities, academic opportunities and school trips and visits to enrich the education of our incredible HLS students.

When we receive the phone call from Ofsted, it will be on a Monday and the inspection will take place on a Tuesday and Wednesday. When we receive this phone call, we will write to all parents to inform them of the inspection and to ask them to complete a parental survey. We would really appreciate the support of our parents to complete this survey. It is vital that the inspectors hear about all of the wonderful things that happen here at Higham Lane School; a positive Ofsted inspection will make it much easier for the school to continue to recruit the very best staff as we do at present, which in turn means that your child will continue to get the very best possible teachers and the best education we can provide. Thank you for your support and we will keep you posted when we are contacted by Ofsted.

### Attendance:

Bridget Phillipson, the new education secretary, wrote to all headteachers a few days ago and in her letter she talked about attendance being a priority for her as one in five children nationally are still persistently absent, missing a day every other week; she talked about the negative impact this is having on academic progress and the difficulties this is causing for the students when they miss lessons and fall behind and then feel anxious about attending lessons. I would like to personally thank you as our parents and carers for supporting the school and your child and ensuring that your child has excellent attendance. Our attendance currently stands at around 94% which is approximately 2% above national average. Whilst we understand that there are occasions where a child needs to be absent from school, we urge our parents to always send your child into school where you can so that your child can continue to thrive in school and not fall behind. Thank you so much for your support.

### Cold weather:

As you will be aware, Warwickshire has been experiencing very cold temperatures this recently, and the temperature has rarely been above zero until the later part of the week. This of course has led to icy conditions and in particular on our local lakes, ponds, and other bodies of water. To help raise awareness of the dangers of ice, Warwickshire Fire and Rescue Service has created a video on the dangers of venturing on to ice and important information on what to do in an emergency situation. We are sharing this video with you so you can discuss with your child. We will also be showing the video and discussing in school.
