Safety Message: Happy safe Halloween/Bonfire Night: with darker nights approaching, it is crucial that students are reminded of what we, as a school community, expect in terms of behaviour.

Parents/carers and students should be aware of our two-way information sharing agreement with Warwickshire Police. This joint approach helps us intervene early to prevent and reduce crime and antisocial behaviour involving our students and provide support and up-to-date safety messages. In partnership with the police, we would like to remind our students about the following:

- Anti-social behaviour: Halloween can be frightening for those who don't like surprises, only approach houses decorated for the occasion.
- Personal Safety: Be aware of your surroundings, take care of friends and family members and keep valuables out of public view.
- Social Media: Use social media positively and avoid negativity. Comments/actions may be traced back to you.





- · Weapons in public places: Carrying a knife or weapon can lead to a criminal record and serious consequences.
- Off-road bikes & E-Scooters: These can only be ridden on private land with permission. They are illegal to use on roads or public places.
- Remember the company you keep: Association with those who break the law may have legal consequences for you.
